Tony's Tip

This is a summary I took from one of Charles Goren's books and found very helpful.

Responding to your partner's take out double.

By making a take out double of an opponent's opening bid your partner is announcing a hand of at least opening strength. Your response must include both high card points and any distributional values. Many inexperienced players are prone to underestimate the value of their hands. Here is a guide:

0 to 5 points, a poor hand. Bid as cheaply as possible.

6 to 8 points is a fair hand. Bid again if partner raises your response. If there is an intervening bid after partner's double, make a free bid if possible. Eg, 1D X 1H ? With a 4 carded spade suit bid 1s.

9 to 10 points is a good hand. With a good 5 carded major suit jump one level. If partner raises your response, bid to game. Eg, 1C X pass ? Bid 2H or 2S with a good 5 carded suit. **11 to 12 points**. A probable game is on. Bid one more than is necessary to encourage partner to go to game even with a minimal double. However a jump response by partner is not forcing on you to bid again and you may pass. You have shown the full value of your hand.

13 points or more. Game going hand. Jump directly to game. If however you first wish your partner (the doubler) to bid his suit or describe his hand, you may cue bid the opponents suit first.

Eg, 1H X pass 2H. Such a cue bid is 100% forcing on partner to bid again. You are telling partner you have game values and wish her to describe her hand. Be sure you have partnership agreement on this or matters may become confusing.

To put action to be taken by both doubler and responder into simpler terms:

If you are responding to a take out double it is recommended that you bid twice as much as you would normally. The strength of your partner's hand can range from opening strength to a possible slam. Partner will then know you are bidding the maximum value of your hand and can decide the next step.

If you are the take out doubler, bid about half as much as it is your habit to do (remember you are forcing partner to bid). Your partner may have a bust hand.





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
